As a child you probably heard you Mum saying it to the next door neighbours whilst chatting on the front step, "Ah well... we've all got our crosses to bear." We grow up in the belief that crosses are undesirable and something to be got rid of. In fact, we spend a disproportionate part of our lives trying to get rid of our crosses. We dodge the burdensome neighbour who demands too much of our time, we limit the number of visits to an elderly relative and we ration the amount of money and time we give to charitable causes. After all, we have very busy



lives, but what is the point of having very busy lives if our lives lack substance. Today we find Jesus talking about his journey to Jerusalem and the fate he will meet there. Peter is upset and tries to talk Jesus out of it. Any of us would have done the same thing in Peter's shoes, and so for Peter and for all of us, Jesus delivers a strong message. When we attempt to deny our purpose in life and opt instead for an easy option, we allow Satan to place stumbling blocks in our lives. It is foolish to deny our crosses. Our crosses are what define us. Our crosses shape our values and make us better people, so why should we be tempted to side step them in pursuit of a life that is shallow and self centred? We all want to make money, improve our homes, eat well and ensure our children pass exams and get good jobs. Jesus wants us to make money for the good of others, improve the welfare of others, build shelters for the homeless, feed the hungry and bring our children up to do likewise. It's a hard lesson to learn, but nobody ever saved the world in the pursuit of comfort.

Jesus began to make it clear to his disciples that he was destined to go to Jerusalem and suffer grievously at the hands of the elders and chief priests and scribes, to be put to death and to be raised up on the third day. Then, taking him aside, Peter started to remonstrate with him. 'Heaven preserve you, Lord," he said. 'This must not happen to you. But he turned and said to Peter, "Get behind me, Satan!
