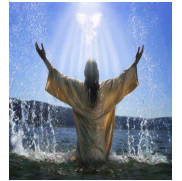

A reading from the prophet Isaiah.

Thus says the Lord: Oh, come to the water all you who are thirsty; though you have no money, come! Why spend money on what is not bread, your wages on what fails to satisfy? Listen, listen to me and you will have good things to eat and rich food to enjoy. Pay attention, come to me; listen and your soul will live. With you I will make an everlasting covenant out of the favours promised to David. See, I have made of you a witness to the peoples, a leader and a master of the nations. See, you will summon a nation you never knew, those unknown will come hurrying to you, for the sake of the Lord your God. Seek the Lord while he is still to be found, call to him while he is still near. Let the wicked man abandon his way. Let him turn back to the Lord who will take pity on him, to our God who is rich in forgiving; for my thoughts are not your thoughts, my ways are above your ways, Yes, as the rain and the snow come down from heavens and do not return to me without watering the earth, making it yield and giving growth to provide seed for the Sower and bread for the eating, so the word that goes from my mouth does not return to me empty, without carrying out my will and succeeding in what it was sent to do.

It is true, God sent his word to the people of Israel, and it was to them that the good news of peace was brought by Jesus Christ-but Jesus Christ is Lord of all. You must have heard about the recent happenings in Judea: about Jesus of Nazareth and how he began in Galilee after John had been preaching baptism. God anointed him with the Holy Spirit and with power, and because God was with him, Jesus went about doing good and curing all who had fallen into the power of the devil.

No sooner had he come up out of the water than he saw the heavens torn apart and the Spirit, like a dove, descending on him. And a voice came from heaven, "you are my Son, the beloved; my favour rests on you"
