

The Master's Voice

"My sheep hear my voice," says Jesus, "I know them and they follow me. "Hearing Jesus voice doesn't seem too difficult. We are faced with choices all day every day. Surely every time we steer towards a good decision we are listening to Jesus' voice. Every time we make a poor decision > we are tuned in only to our own human agenda.



Surely hearing Jesus' voice is just about doing the right thing in each of the circumstances we find ourselves in. But what if it's not quite as simple as that? Imagine what it would be like to meet Jesus on Judgment Day, to hear him say, "Didn't you hear me? 

If you are questioning us today about an act of kindness to a cripple, and asking us how he was healed, then I am glad to tell you all, and would indeed be glad to tell the whole people of Israel, that it was by the name of Jesus Christ the Nazarene, the one you crucified, whom God raised from the dead, by this name and by no other that this man is able to stand up perfectly healthy, here in your presence today. This is the stone rejected by you the builders, but which has proved to be the keystone. For of all the names in the world given to men, this is the only one by which we can be saved.' Because the world refused to acknowledge him, therefore it does not acknowledge us. My dear people, we are already the children of God but what we are to be in the future has not yet been revealed; all we know is, that when it is revealed we shall be like him because we shall see him as he really is. THE GOSPEL (10:11-18)

Priest: The Lord be with you

People: And with your Spirit

A reading from the Gospel according to John.

Jesus said: 'I am the good shepherd: the good shepherd is-one who lays down his life for his sheep. The hired man, since he is not the shepherd abandons the sheep and runs away as soon as he sees a wolf coming, and then the wolf attacks and scatters the sheep; this is because he is only a hired man and has no concern for the sheep. I am the good shepherd; I know my own and my own know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father; and I lay down my life for my sheep. And there are other sheep I have that are not of this fold, and these I have to lead as well. They too will listen to my voice, and there will be only one flock, and one shepherd.
