The Gift of Life

Most of us struggle to make the most of our lives. We worry about passing exams and getting into the right university. We worry about finding the right partner, we worry that we have left it too late to have children, and we worry whether or not we are in the right career. We have learned from an early age that it isn't life itself that is important but how we fill our lives. But even having realised this very important fact, we still strive to live longer lives rather than better lives. When we read how Jesus cured and even brought people back from the dead, we notice one very important similarity, Jesus doesn't just add years to people's lives he changes lives. He doesn't grant fairy tale endings with the wave of a magic wand, rather he makes his subjects whole and complete and ready to live life with a new outlook. Both the women in today's story must have felt that life had slipped through their fingers. The woman who had suffered haemorrhaging for twelve years had reached the depths of despair. Jesus was her last and only hope. The young girl seemed beyond any help, she had already been declared dead. Jesus gave them both their lives back. Is it likely that they would have gone on living exactly as before? Probably not! There's nothing like a second chance, especially at death's door to make us re-evaluate. The gospel call to change our lives is part and parcel of the call to faith, a faith in a God who saves lives and changes lives. Whether it be the very public faith shown today by Jairus the synagogue leader, or the very private display of faith shown by the destitute woman, faith and how we make the best of life goes hand in hand.

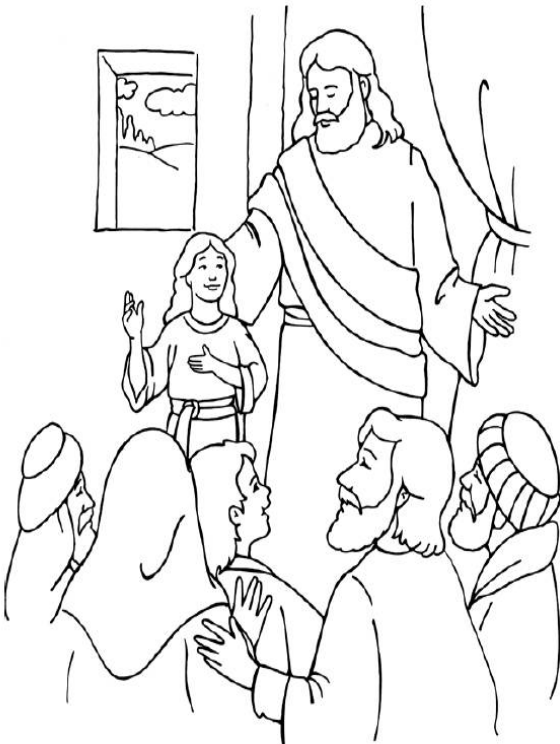

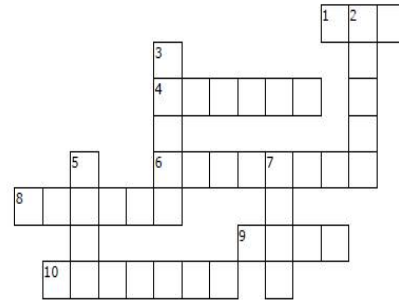

A reading from the Gospel according to Mark.

When Jesus had crossed in the boat to the other side, a large crowd gathered round him and he stayed by the lakeside. Then one of the synagogue officials came up, Jairus by name, and seeing him, fell at his feet and pleaded with him earnestly, saying, 'My little daughter is desperately sick. Do come and lay your hands on her to make her better and save her life.' Jesus went with him and a large crowd followed him; they were pressing all round him. 'While he was still speaking some people arrived from the house of the synagogue official to say, 'Your daughter is dead: why put the Master to any further trouble?' But Jesus had overheard this remark of theirs and he said to the official, 'Do not be afraid; only have faith.' And he allowed no one to go with him except Peter and James and John the brother of James. So they came to the official's house and Jesus noticed all the commotion, with people weeping and wailing unrestrainedly. He went in and said to them, 'Why all this commotion and crying? The child is not dead, but asleep.' But they laughed at him. So he turned them all out and, taking with him the child's father and mother and his own companions, he went into the place where the child lay. And taking the child by the hand he said to her, 'Talitha, kumi!' which means, 'Little girl, I tell you to get up.' The little girl got up at once and began to walk about, for she was twelve years old. At this they were overcome with astonishment, and he ordered them strictly not to let anyone know about it, and told them to give her something to eat.

Confirmation & First Communion Ceremonies – Edenderry Parish 2021

We wish to update you on matters in relation to Confirmation and First Communion ceremonies in Edenderry Parish this year. As you are aware, attendees at all Church ceremonies and indoor and outdoor events are subject to Government guidelines and we have just received notice from the diocesan office, that services as listed above may resume from early July, however due to Fr PJ's ongoing illness and absence from the Parish, we are not in a position to offer any ceremonies until September at the earliest. We are currently depending on priests from other parishes to assist Fr Larry at weekend masses and funerals.

It has been agreed by the Parish Liturgy Group, that Confirmations will take place mid-late September and First Communion will take place mid – late October, subject to Government guidelines regarding Church services and indoor / outdoor gatherings. these timelines are **provisional and subject to change**, but we will endeavour to finalise the exact dates later in the Summer and these will be posted on Parish website, Link -Up and Facebook page and will be announced at weekend Masses.
