THE TROUBLE WITH MICACLES

The trouble with miracles is that we can sometimes put them on a par with a magic trick. When we listen to the stories of Jesus' miracles we can become overly interested in the miracle itself. In the gospel of John, the miracles are not referred to as miracles but as 'signs'. In fact, the gospel of John is called the



book of the seven signs. The interesting thing about calling a 'miracle' a 'sign' is that we become less interested in the mechanics of the miracle, and more interested in looking for a message. In today's reading, Jesus turns water into wine at the wedding feast of Cana, and we are asked to look at what this might mean for us. It seems odd that Jesus' first miracle should be about turning water into wine. Why did he do it? Was it to save the bride and groom embarrassment? Was it to show that God is merciful kind and compassionate? A huge amount has been written about the meaning of this story, but John sums it up very clearly for himself. The transformation of water into wine is the first of many such signs of which John writes, "These are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through this belief you may have life in his name." This is the significance of the miracle. It is important that we don't just remember the story in isolation. At this time of year we see the story unfurling as part of a sequence. A couple of weeks ago we remembered the call to Jews and Gentiles alike in the story of the Magi. At Jesus' baptism we were invited to share the same baptism, and finally the wedding feast of Cana symbolises the celebrating of unity between Christ and ourselves. And yes... all of God's miracles show his mercy kindness and compassion.

SECOND READING (12:4-11)

The particular way in which the Spirit is given to each person is for a good purpose. One may have the gift of preaching with wisdom given by the Spirit;

another may have the gift of preaching instruction given him by the same Spirit; and another the gift of faith given by the same Spirit; another again the gift of healing, through his one Spirit; one, the power of miracles; another, prophecy; another the gift of recognising spirits; another the gift of tongues and another the ability to interpret them. THE GOSPEL (2:1-11)

Priest: The Lord be with you People: And with your Spirit

A reading from the Gospel according to John.

There was a wedding in Cana in Galilee. The mother of Jesus was there, and Jesus and his disciples had also been invited. When they ran out of wine, since the wine provided for the wedding was all finished, the mother of Jesus said to him, 'They have no wine, Jesus said, 'Woman, why turn to me? My hour has not come yet. His mother said to the servants, 'Do whatever he tells you. There were six stone water jars standing there, meant for the ablutions that are customary among the Jews; each could hold twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to the servants, 'Fill the jars with water, and they filled them to the brim. Draw some out now; he told them and take it to the steward. They did this; the steward tasted the water, and it had turned into wine. Having no idea where it came from-only the servants who had drawn the water knew the steward called the bridegroom and said, 'People generally serve the best wine first, and keep the cheaper sort till the guests have had plenty to drink; but you have kept the best wine till now. This was the first of the signs given by Jesus: it was given at Cana in Galilee. He let his glory be seen, and his disciples believed in him.
