True Love Never Gives Up

It doesn't matter how far we've travelled from God, there is always a way back. The parable of the Prodigal Son is great comfort for those of us whose lives are in such a mess that we can see no glimmer of § hope. But does that mean that the parable is not relevant for the rest of us? The wonderful thing about the seemingly simple parable that Jesus tells us today, is that it is really two parables rolled into one. Whichever part of the story speaks loudest to us is dependent upon the son with whom we most identify. The story of the wayward son, who squandered his father's money and then returns home for forgiveness, speaks to anyone who has turned away from God but wants to put his or her life on track again. This parable is for anyone who has made bad decisions without much thought of the consequences. Bad decisions take us in the wrong direction and we might only realise it when we finally hit rock bottom. Only then might we admit the truth to ourselves; only then might we confess "I can't carry on like this... something has to give... something must change!" If our sympathies lie with the prodigal son's older brother, then this parable speaks to us from a different point of view. The parable is for all who judge others as unworthy of our respect or companionship. This parable is for all those who lack empathy. Like the older son who resents his brother's welcome home party, we disappoint God when we resent others being given a second chance, or when we are unable to forgive. The one character in the story that is beyond reproach is the father. Like God, the father is loving and compassionate. The father's love enables him to look beyond the transgressions of his younger son. Similarly, the father is patient and understanding towards his self righteous son. The father is ready to forgive even before he is asked to forgive. The father doesn't give up on either son. His love is exemplary. Today we can further our Lenten journey by not putting ourselves above others, by not being judgmental and by allowing others their second chance in life just as we may one day need our second chance.





THE GOSPEL (15:1-3. 11-32)

Priest: The Lord be with you **People:** And with your Spirit

A reading from the Gospel according to Luke.

The tax collectors and the sinners were all seeking the company of Jesus to hear what he had to say, and the Pharisees and the scribes complained. This

man' they said 'welcomes sinners and eats with them'. So he spoke this parable to them: A man had two sons. The younger said to his father, "Father, let me have the share of the estate that would come to me.' So the father divided the property between them. A few days later, the younger son got together everything he had and left for a distant country where he squandered his money on a life of debauchery. When he had spent it all, that country experienced a severe famine, and now he began to feel the pinch, so he hired himself out to one of the local inhabitants who put him on his farm to feed the pigs. And he would willingly have filled his belly with the husks pigs were eating but no one offered him anything. Then he came to his senses and said, 'How many of my fathers paid servants have more food than they want, and here am I dying of hunger! I will leave this place and go to my father and say: Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you; I no longer deserve to be called your son; treat me as one of your paid servants." So he left the place and went back to his father. While he was still a long way off, his father saw him and was moved with pity. He ran to the boy, clasped him in his arms and kissed him tenderly. Then his son said, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you. I no longer deserve to be called your son. But the father said to his servants, 'Quick! Bring out the best robe and put it on him; put a ring on his finger and sandals on his feet. Bring the calf we have been fattening, and kill it; we are going to have a feast, a celebration, because this son of mine was dead and has come back to life; he was lost and is found. And they began to celebrate. Now the elder son was out in the fields, and on his way back, as he drew near the house, he could hear music and dancing. Calling one of the servants he asked what it was all about. "Your brother has come" replied the "and your father has killed the calf we had fattened because he has got him back safe and sound". He was angry then and refused to go in, and his father came out to plead with him; but he answered his father, "Look, all these years I have slaved for you and never once disobeyed your orders, yet you never offered me so much as a kid for me to celebrate with my friends. But for this son of yours, when he comes back after swallowing up your property-he and his women-you kill the calf we had been fattening." The father said, "My Son, you are with me always and all I have is yours. But it is only right we should celebrate and rejoice, because your brother here was dead and has come to life; he was lost and is found.""

Dear Friends

Thank you for all your cards and letters sending me good wishes for Christmas and the New Year. They mean a great deal to me and have helped greatly in keeping my spirits up.

Not everyone is aware, I think, that on 29th April 2021 last year I suffered a severe stroke while painting the fence in my garden in Edenderry. Fortunately, I managed to call for help and within a short time I was brought by ambulance to Mullingar Hospital and later to Tullamore Hospital where I remained for six weeks before moving to Esker Ri, a nursing home in Clara, Co Offaly.

In November 2021, I was admitted to the National Rehabilitation Hospital in Rochestown Avenue, Dun Laoghaire for intensive therapy to maximise my recovery. After three months working with the team there, I have now moved to Altadore Nursing Home in Glenageary, Dublin where I will receive ongoing support and care. This will be my new home.

It has been a challenging journey, but I have received great support from family and friends during these past eleven months. Of course, I miss my parish in Edenderry greatly, but your continuous prayers and good wishes have given me great strength and hope. And I know you will continue to do so.

At Christmas I joined in the Edenderry Christmas mass through webcam from my wheelchair, and I was delighted to see the church, the congregation, altar servers, readers, and all the choirs looking their very best. Bishop Denis celebrated mass with me from my wheelchair in the Rehabilitation Hospital on St Stephen's Day and that was very special.

I will keep you in my prayers, just as I know you will keep me in yours. I wish you and all your family a safe, healthy, and blessed 2022.
