You Can't Choose Your Neighbours

The Good Samaritan – We all know the story, and we all understand it. The parable teaches us that everybody is our neighbour, and that everyone deserves our compassion. We all understand it, but we have huge problems remembering it, and even bigger problems putting it into practice. The Samaritans



were those northerners who had intermarried, whose religion and race was not as pure. The Jews certainly did not regard the Samaritans as their neighbours and yet the Samaritan in this story is the hero. The Samaritan models the compassion we are supposed to adopt. But there's a problem. The man who fell into the hands of the robbers is easy to sympathise with. Most of us would have been good neighbours in this situation, even if it was just to stop and dial 999 on a mobile phone. The challenge for would-be good Samaritans is to recognise our neighbours in those who don't immediately invite our sympathy; those people who don't share our values, our background our upbringing, or our culture. The challenge is to recognise our neighbours in those who instead of inviting our compassion, invite only our fear, prejudice, ignorance or even apathy. Or perhaps we do recognise our neighbours but feel there is nothing we can do for them. After all, we can hardly afford to give money to every begger on every street corner. We need to look a little deeper at what being a good neighbour is about. Being a good neighbour is more than giving money out to vagrants on street corners, it's what lies in our hearts. To love our neighbours is to feel compassion for the vagrant, empathy for the refugee, sympathy for the prisoner. Love of neighbour is treating everyone the way we would like to be treated ourselves. We might not be able to give money to every vagrant we spot, but we can certainly give something. If we are fearful of giving money in the street we can give to a charity, if we can't give money we could give food, belongings, or simply our time and our skills. 'Who is my neighbour?' It's a loaded question. Can we truly keep the commandment that leads to eternal life?



A reading from the Gospel according to Luke.

There was a lawyer who, to disconcert Jesus, stood up and said to him, "Master, what must I do to inherit eternal life? He said to him, "What is written in the law? What do you read there?" He replied, 'You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your strength, and with all your mind, and your neighbour as yourself." "You have answered right," said Jesus, "do this and life is yours. But the man was anxious to justify himself and said to Jesus, 'And who is my neighbour?" Jesus replied, "A man was once on his way down from Jerusalem to Jericho and fell into the hands of brigands; they took all he had, beat him and then made off, leaving him half dead. Now a priest happened to be travelling down the same road, but when he saw the man, he passed by on the other side. In the same way a Levite who came to the place saw him, and passed by on the other side. But a Samaritan traveller who came upon him was moved with compassion when he saw him. He went up and bandaged his wounds, pouring oil and wine on them. He then lifted him on to his own mount, carried him to the inn and looked after him. Next day, he took out two denarii and handed them to the innkeeper. 'Look after him,' he said and on my way back I will make good any extra expense you have.' "Which of these three, do you think, proved himself a neighbour to the man who fell into the brigands hands" The one who took pity on him" he replied. Jesus said to him, 'Go, and do the same yourself."
