God's Cosmic Hall

We live in an age of immediate answers. We type a question into 'Google' and the answer is a mouse click away. We dial a call centre or 'help desk' and get an immediate solution. Could we have begun to see prayer in the same way? Do we imagine



prayer to be a direct line to some cosmic call centre and get frustrated when God doesn't answer by return? Worse, do we give up on God when we feel that our prayers are being ignored? We give up on prayer for all sorts of reasons. We can't remember a time when our prayers were answered so we begin to suspect that it's a naive activity. We are told that prayer is about building a relationship with God, but how do we know that God is listening? Then when our prayers are not answered we are told that perhaps we were praying for the wrong thing in the first place, or that our expectations are immature. We are told that God listens to our prayers but knows that what we are praying for would be wrong for us, or that our prayers were answered all along but that we failed to recognise the answers. This parable however doesn't tell us any of those things, it simply tells us not to give up. Persistence in all things is key to success, so why should persistence in prayer be any different? Persistence in prayer is good not because God is hard of hearing or slow to respond, but because we learn something about ourselves in our persistence. Perhaps if we don't persist in something we don't want it as much as we thought. Perhaps in our most persistent needs we notice and appreciate God's intervention all the more? Undoubtedly, when our most persistent prayers our answered we experience faith in God all the more powerfully than we ever did before. At the end of the day, only God knows why some prayers are granted and others not. Today's advice is to have faith in prayer, not to lose heart, and above all, trust in God. It is unlikely that God is operating a cosmic call centre offering immediate advice and solutions. The likelihood is that we will have to wait for an answer to our prayers, and as we wait we must abide in trust and not despair.
