Death is not the End

Today's gospel concludes a trio of themes. Two weeks ago we heard how a blind man found not only physical sight but spiritual sight. Last week we heard about the woman at *4* the well who not only found water to drink, but the answers with which to quench her spiritual thirst. Today's theme is 'life'. Today, very publicly, Jesus brings Lazarus back to life. An otherwise bizarre story sets the stage for a miracle and its meaning for us all. Sisters, Martha and



Mary send word to Jesus to tell him that his beloved friend Lazarus is seriously ill. We expect Jesus to rush to his friend's side, but instead he stays away for another two days. By the time he gets round to travelling back to Judea, his good friend is dead. If we didn't know better, Jesus' behaviour might smack of indifference. Of course Jesus is not indifferent to the pain of his friends. Jesus knows that he can call Lazarus back to life, more importantly; he knows that he can use the miracle to teach us something very important about our mortality. "I am the resurrection and the life," he says, "Those who believe in me, even though they die, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die." It is likely that those who witnessed the miracle on that day focussed on the miracle worker himself and his power to give life back to the dead. But what of Lazarus himself? The real miracle for Lazarus wasn't just that he'd been given his old life back; he'd been given a brand new life. The themes from the last couple of weeks draw together. Spiritual insight, spiritual water and miraculous life. We don't need to die to be brought back to live a new life. All we need to do is shed the old one. We don't have to sit and wait for an eternal life in the hereafter, we can live the life we have on earth and live it in fullness and meaning. Jesus allowed his friend to die so that he could reveal God's glory. As Christians we live our lives with deeper significance. We live with one foot in this world and one foot in the next, confident that death is not the end.







Though your body may be dead it is because of sin, but if Christ is in you then your spirit is life itself because you have been justified; and if the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead is living in you, then he who raised Jesus from the dead will give life to your own mortal bodies through his Spirit living in you. THE GOSPEL (11:1-45) Priest: The Lord be with you People: And with your Spirit A reading from the Gospel according to John.

The sisters sent this message to Jesus, 'Lord the man you love is ill. 'On receiving the message, Jesus said, 'This sickness will end not in death but in God's glory, and through it the Son of God will be glorified. Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus, yet when he heard that Lazarus was ill he stayed where he was for two more days before saying to the disciples. 'Let us go to Judaea. On arriving, Jesus found that Lazarus had been in the tomb for four days already. When Martha heard that Jesus had come she went to meet him. Mary remained sitting in the house. Martha said to Jesus, 'If you had been here, my brother would not have died, but I know that, even now, whatever you ask of God, he will grant you. 'Your brother' said Jesus to her 'will rise again,' Martha said, 'I know he will rise again at the resurrection on the last day,' Jesus said: 'I am the resurrection and the life. If anyone believes in me, even though he dies he will live , and whoever lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this? 'Yes Lord' she said I believe that you are the Christ the Son of God, the one who was to come into this world. Jesus said in great distress, with a sigh that came straight from the heart, 'Where have you put him? They said, 'Lord come and see, Jesus wept and the Jews said, 'See how much he loved him! But there were some who remarked, 'He opened the eyes of the blind man, could he not have prevented this man's death? Still sighing, Jesus reached the tomb: it was a cave with a stone to close the opening. Jesus said, 'Take the stone away. Martha said to him 'Lord, by now he will smell this is the fourth day, 'Jesus replied; Have I not told you that if you believe you will see the glory of God? So they took away the stone. Then Jesus lifted up his eyes and said: 'Father, I thank you for hearing my prayer. I knew indeed that you always hear me but I speak for the sake of all these who stand round me, so that they may believe it was you who sent me. When he had said this, he cried in a loud voice, Lazarus, here ! Come out! The dead man came out, his feet and hands bound with bands of stuff and a cloth round his face. Jesus said to them 'Unbind him, let him go free. Many of the Jews who had come to visit Mary and had seen what he did believed in him.
